Not too far from Disney World in an area called Vineland is Vineland Cemetery. There are only two graves and both are of men who served in the Civil War. The units they were in were fighting units. Their individual service records and their connection to Florida I don't know much about. We, as Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil war

strive to preserve their memory and give them the respect and appreciation that they deserve. Both of their names can be found on the National Park data base of Civil War soldiers and sailors. Know that six years or so ago, Marshall Polston, the young man pictured, as part of an Eagle Scout project led a group that included L. L. Mitchell Camp 4 of the Sons of Union Veterans in restoring this cemetery. There was thick underbrush, no fence and no entrance way. In the pictures you can now see a fence, thick vegetation lurking in the background and an area around the graves that could use sprucing up. This was the second time we had returned to keep things respectable.






After the better part of a work day everything looked better as you can see.
